ZAMBIA PROJECT:



In November, lightning took out 2 **solar pumps** at Chitokoloki. Then, more recently, they lost their big 25 horsepower **river water pump**. Because it was the dry time of year, they were running out of water. DNS was able to help pay for the replacement of the solar pumps and give toward the upcoming replacement of the river pump.

Don McKay had this to report of his recent trip to Zambia: “I have just returned from Chitokoloki as I was asked to travel over to help the folks there transition to **Zesco Power**,

a new government supplied power system. Zesco Power comes from a newly built power grid in the west, north/west region of Zambia from a new power dam. It seems stable at this point, but the power authority requires all homes connected to the system to have individual metering, so there are around 90 new 60A services to install. My purpose was to **tie in the 3-phase system** to the Hospital (now 200A) and to verify the operation of the system to the powerhouse we had built, which was supplied by generator & solar and is now supplied by Zesco. After having Zesco do a few modifications to their system, it is now up and running and supplies 3-phase 400 V power to the maintenance shop, wood shop, mill & generator house and power for the water well pump, which has been purchased with DNS support and is on its way. While at the station, I set up an automatic control so that, when the pump arrives, it can be supplied by the new Zesco power and automatically pump water from the river to the water tower and maintain full level there in conjunction with the current solar pumps, which are presently on overload as they run nearly continuously. When the pump arrives in about 2 weeks, the river water level should be low enough to tie it into the existing pipe system. It will certainly be a blessing, as the dry season continues until mid-November. The Lord certainly takes care of the needs of His people and we can continue to know that by His hand He controls. When the pump arrives, we will update with pictures from the installation. Thanks again.”

MINISTRY IN INDIA:



This is one of the Christian Brethren Assemblies that DNS helped to fund as well as putting in a well there. It is one of the ministry centers from which outreach is conducted to nearby villages. There are 3 village locations where evening meetings and Children’s programs are now going on.



In these pictures, you can see another larger **church ministry center** that was started, but has been put on hold because of covid. This center will be used as an assembly, Bible school and outreach center. It will reach out to 30-40 villages in the area. There will be facilities for people from outside the area to stay. They are thinking of expanding the plans to include a nursery or small school. There are so many needs!

On the left, you can see part of the 150x90 feet of ground they leveled from the hilly slope. Work will resume as soon as the lockdown is over and materials are available. Supplies have to be transported from 100-120 miles away since the assembly is in a remote hilly area. This increases expenses and delays progress.



Covid has affected people in this area who are deprived of medical facilities. It is reported that, unless the Lord does a miracle for them, their condition will be very poor. They have to drive 60-70 miles up and down hills to get to a medical facility other than a small clinic.
